raises or increases were authorized and that said Board of County Commissioners specifically intend by this Resolution to comply strictly with the terms and conditions of House Bill No. 73 of the 1955 Legislature.

1955 Legislature. NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that salary increases or additional compensation is hereby allowed to all county officers, their deputies, assistants or employees in the amount and upon the conditions following: All elective officers are hereby granted increases in the amount of 15% of the salary fixed by the laws of the State of Kansas. for such officer and all other deputies, assistants, or employees, of permanent classification, are hereby allowed a flat salary or compensa-tion increase of \$10.00 per month to those deputies, assistants, or employees who have been employed continuously by Douglas County, Kansas, for a period of one year. That said increases shall be paid for services rendered on and after April 1, 1955, and shall remain in full force and be effective for services rendered up to and including December 31, 1955, that the increases or additional compensation herein provided shall be exclusive of all increases previously granted under the authority of the statutes repealed by House Bill Wo. 73, and that the effect of this Reacolution is to keep the salaries at the same and exact figure as they have been immediately prior to said April 1, 1955. That where any elective officer holds two or more county offices, the 15% additional compensation herein provided shall apply only to the salary as fixed by statute, for the office to which said officer was elected and shall not apply to salaries paid to said dofficer for other than the one office to which he was elected. Such additional salary or compensation shall be paid to elective officer, as hereinbefore provided, and to all deputies, assistants and employees, in the amount and upon the conditions hereinbefore provided, in equal monthy installments, beginning with April 1, 1955, and ending December 31, 1955.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that this Resolution and each and every provision thereof, is adopted with the sole and specific intent of granting salary or compensation increases necessitated by cost of living increases which previously have been in force and which by this Resolution, are to be continued at the same rate and in the same amounts as the salaries of such officers, deputies, assistants and employees were established prior to April 1, 1955, that House Bill Nq. 73, by its terms, authorizes the increases here in provided and futher provides that such increases shall be granted in addition to and not inconflict with any of the provisions of Chapter 28 of the General Statutes of Kansas, 1949, or amendments thereto, except for those statutes specifically repealed by said House Bill No. 73. It is the further intention of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, to fully and strictly comply with the Authority and discretion granted said Board of County Commissioners by the enactment of House Bill No. 73.
