The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

The Board discussed road matters with J. I. Rice, County Engineer.

The Board received quarterly fee report from the Register of Deeds.

The Board received approval from the State Commission of Revenue and Taxation to issue No Fund warrants, Order #493.

The Board ordered increase in salary of County Employees, as per the following Resolution:

#### R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, have met at a regular session on this 3rd day of September, 1955, the following Commissioners being present: Chairman, Charles E. Banning, Commissioner Elmer W. Ousdahl, and Commissioner, D. M. Harris.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners now find it advisable to provide additional compensation to all County Officers, their deputies, assistants and employees, except employees of the Welfare Department of Douglas County, Kansas, which said employees are regulated by Civil Service requirements and consequently not included herein. Said Commissioners further find that said additional compensation shall be paid to all elective officers in the amount of five per cent (5%) of the salary fixed by statute for each such elective officer, and that all other employees, namely, deputies, assistants, and employees, shall receive a flat salary increase of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) permonth, except employees of the Sheriff's Office, of Douglas County, Kansas, who shall receive a flat salary increase of Twenty Dollars, (\$20.00), after each of said deputies, assistants, and employees have been employed by Douglas County, Kansas, continuously for one year. Further, that the increase herein provided shall be for the period of ten months, beginning on September 1st, 1955, and continuing until and including June 30th, 1956. That the additional
