

tion of the mutual covenants and agreements herein recited, it is by said parties agreed:

1. The second party will furnish and sell to the first party, and the first party will purchase from the second party, road repair materials as follows:
 - (a). 40,000 tons of crushed road rock material of one and $\frac{1}{2}$ inches or less diameter (which will pass through a rock screen of one inch square mesh); and
 - (b). 5,000 additional tons of crushed rock road "cover material" which shall pass through a $\frac{1}{2}$ " rock screen and be retained by a 3/16" rock screen;

for the agreed purchase price of \$1.15 per ton, which purchase price shall be paid to the second party at Lawrence, Kansas, upon estimated tonnage, as and when the material is crushed and stockpiled as herein recited.
2. All screenings, sometimes called "fines", of less than 3/16" created in the production of said "cover material" shall be stockpiled separately by second party or by second party blended into said 40,000 tons of item 1(a) material, as designated by the County Engineer of said County prior to commencement of the crushing operations and, if not so designated by the County Engineer, said screenings will be separately stockpiled; and in either event said screenings will be part of said 40,000 tons 1(a) item.
3. Said material will be crushed at various quarries in Douglas County operated by second party and stockpiled on the premises of said quarrying and crushing sites. The amounts to be processed and stockpiled at the respective sites shall be designated by memo to be delivered by said County Engineer to second party prior to October, 1955.
4. The First party shall weigh each load of rock at the time it removes the same and the second party guarantees the full measurement of the estimated tonnage paid for by the first party in the respective stockpiles.
5. This contract shall be binding upon the heirs, devisees, legatees, successors and assigns of the parties.
