RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, has met at a regular session on this 31st day of December, 1958, the following Commissioners being present: Chairman, Will H. Hayden and Commissioner Walter Kampschroeder.

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners, after being well and fully advised, find that it would be to the best interests of the County to transfer \$33,000.00, which is an amount not in excess of 25% of money credited to the road and bridge fund to a special road, bridge or street building machinery, equipment and bridge building fund, all as provided in Section 68-141 (g) of the 1953 supplement to the General Statutes of Kansas 1949.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that \$33,000.00 which is an amount not to exceed 25% of the amount of money credited to the road and bridge fund be transferred to a Special road, bridge or street building machinery, equipment and bridge building fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be delivered to the County Treasurer and said Treasurer shall credit an amount of \$33,000.00 of the money credited to the road and bridge fund to amount of \$33,000.00 of the money credited to the road and bridge fund to a special road, bridge or street building machinery, equipment and bridge building fund.
