The following Resolution to open road on E. 19th Street, was passed unanimously:

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, have met at a regular session on the 28th day of February, 1959, the following commissioners being present: Walter Kampschroeder, Chairman, Will H. Hayden, Member, and Elmer W. Ousdahl, Member.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners have received and considered the Petition, Bond, Viewers report and Viewers allowance of damages on the Petition for the location of the following described road.

Beginning at center Section Five (5), Township Thirteen (13) South, Range Twenty (20) East, in Douglas County, Kansas, thence east on half section line one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile to one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) corner on the East line of said Section Five (5) and terminating at East Line of said Section Five (5).

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners find that all owners on the above proposed road have given thirty feet easements except Oscar H. and Beulah M. Baker, and said Board further finds that Oscar H. and Beulah M. Baker made a claim for damages for their land and trees on property to be included in said proposed road site.

WHEREAS, the Board examines the easements from all property owners and the viewers report on Oscar H. and Beulah M. Baker's claim for damages and (Recommend) said road to be established, and order the County Surveyor to issue his Order to the Trustees of Wakarusa Township and cause them to open the road for public travel.

It is THEREFORE, BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS, SO RESOLVED AND ORDERED THIS 28TH DAY February, 1959.
