The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

The Board approved a 7% increase in salary for all elective County Officials. Commissioners Kampschroeder and Ousdahl voting in favor, and Commissioner Hayden voting against. Resolution follows:

# RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, have met at a regular adjourned session on the 18th day of July, 1959, the following Commissioners being present: Chairman, Walter Kampschroeder, Member, Elmer Ousdahl; and Member, Will H. Hayden.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners now find it advisable to provide additional compensation to all elected county officers, and their assistants, whose salaries are set by statute as a percentage of the elected official's salary.

Said Commissioners further find that such increases now become advisable and are allowable as a result of House Bill No. 39, which became effective and in force from and after July 1, 1959, and which date being the date published in the statute book.

It is understood that this Resolution shall not alter or amend, but shall be construed as supplemental to and not in conflict with any of the Resolutions heretofore made, prescribing compensation for county officers, deputies, assistants or employees.

That the amount allowable by House Bill No. 39, in the amount of seven and one-half percent (7½%), shall be paid in addition to the base salary for each of the elected county officers as established by the Laws of this State.

Any elective officer who holds two or more county offices, the additional compensation herein provided for shall only be applied to the salary for the office to which he was elected.

That such additional compensation shall be paid in equal monthly installments and shall be-come effective and operative on the 1st day of July, 1959.

The commissioners hereby find and determine that this Resolution is authorized by House Bill No. 39, of the 1959 Legislature and that said Bill, by specific provisions therein, provides that such salary increases or additional compensation, shall be construed not to alter or amend, but shall be supplemental to and not in conflict with any of the provisions of Chapters 19, 20 and 28, of the G.S. of Kansas, 1949, or the 1957 Supplement thereto or any other statute prescribing compensation for county officers, deputies, assistants or employees nor it shall repeal any law.

The Board of County Commissioners find and determine that this Resolution is advisable in order to meet the cost of living increases experienced within Douglas County, Kansas, and that said Board of County Commissioners specifically intend, by this Resolution, to comply strictly with the terms and conditions of House Bill No. 39 of the 1959 Legislature.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS, that salary increases are hereby allowed to all elected county officers, deputies, assistants or employees, in the amount and upon the conditions following:

All elective officers are hereby granted increases in the amount of seven and one-half percent (7½%) of their salaries fixed by the laws of the State of Kansas for such officer. That said increases shall be paid for services rendered on and after the 1st day of July, 1959.

That where any elective officer holds two or more county offices, the additional compensation herein provided for shall only be applied to the salary for the office to which he was elected. That such additional compensation shall be paid in equal monthly in-
