MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, KANSAS, AS THE GOVERNING BODY OF RIVERSIDE SEWER DISTRICT NO. 8, COVERING THE SALE OF SEWER BONDS

Now on this 2nd day of August 1961, the same being a regular meeting day of the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, meeting in the Commissioners' room at the Courthouse in Lawrence, all members being present and participating, to-wit:

Harvey M. Booth and
Elmer W. Ousdahl, Commissioners,

The attorney and County Clerk reviewed for the benefit of new commissioners the history of the temporary financing of Riverside Sewer District #8 and the construction of sewers therein. The Board was reminded that all sewer improvements have been financed through the Lawrence National Bank by the sale of temporary notes carried by the Bank at a rate of 2% per annum. That this rate was substantially lower than the market rate at the time of the issuance of the notes in early 1958, and was much lower than the current rate of public financing.

Mr. Riley Burcham, of the Lawrence National Bank, appeared before the Board and showed the Board recent offerings of sewer improvements bonds by Butler County and school bonds by McPherson. Both were higher than the following firm proposal made by the Lawrence National Bank for the purchase of \$60,000.00 Douglas County, Kansas sewer bonds authorized to be issued by resolution dated August 2, 1961:

Bonds 1 - 9 inclusive, maturing in the year 1962 - 64, a rate of 2 1/2%

Bonds 10 - 18 inclusive, maturing in the year 1965 - 67, a rate of 3%

Bonds 19 - 60 inclusive, maturing in the year 1968 - 79, a rate of 3 1/2%

After full discussion and review of the proposal and a complete analysis of the present bond market, the Board of Commissioners, upon motion duly made and seconded, accepted the proposal submitted by the Lawrence National Bank, subject only to refusal by the State School Fund Commission.

On motion duly made and seconded, the meeting thereupon adjourned.
