R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, have met at a regular session on this 7th day of January, 1963, the following commissioners being present, Elmer Ousdahl, Chairman, Walter Kampschroeder, member, and Harvey Booth, Member, AND

WHEREAS, said Board has become increasingly aware of the inequities that presently exist in the assessed valuation of Douglas County Real Estate in general, and

WHEREAS, said Board has studied this problem for several years, and

WHEREAS, in the course of reflecting upon this problem the system of records kept in connection with present assessment procedures have been found to be obsolete, and

WHEREAS, said Board desires to employ expert, clerical, or other qualified assistants to aid such Board in the performance of its duties as the County Board of Equalization, and

WHEREAS, said Board in its discretion deems it necessary to contract for an appraisal of all of the properties within Douglas County, Kansas, for the purpose of aiding the Board in assessment equalization,

BE IT NOW THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that this Board proceed under authority of Kansas G.S. 1961 Supp., 79-1607 to negotiate a contract deemed to be in the best interests of Douglas County, Kansas, for an appraisal of all of the properties within Douglas County, Kansas, for the purpose of aiding the Board in assessment equalization, said appraisal to include the creation of a permanent system of records that will perpetuate the objectives of maintaining fair and equalized valuations for all property located in Douglas County, Kansas, and that every effort be made to negotiate with all persons interested and qualified to conduct said appraisal.
