The Board further finds that the special fund for the Douglas County reappraisal project now has been depleted to where there is not sufficient money to pay said aforesaid bill and said fund will not be available to pay said bill before February 1965.

The Board further finds that the Lawrence National Bank of Douglas County will hold said warrant for said County for the appraisal project with interest at two and one-half (2½) per cent for the time said money is used.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, issue a warrant of said county in the amount of Seven Thousand, Three Hundred dollars and Eighty cents (\$7,300.80). payable to Cole-Layer-Trumble Company and that said warrant be payable through The Lawrence National Bank with interest at two and one-half per cent per annum until said warrant is paid by Douglas County, Kansas.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board present.

Road and bridge matters were discussed with the County Engineer, Casey Rice.

Additional bills for equipment and supplies were approved, being within budget limitations.

Motion was made by Mr. Kampschroeder, seconded by Mr. Booth, that the Board of County Commissioners instruct the County Engineer to prepare an area north of boat ramp at Lone Star Lake for the purpose of swimming within a specified area, approximately 50' by 180'. That at present no facilities or conveniences will be erected at this area. Additional parking may be provided. Motion carried. Kampschroeder and Booth voting "yes" - Mr. Ousdahl voting "no" and he asked that his reasons be made a part of the minutes, as below:

"I vote no first because we now have a tremendous problem in law enforcement at Lone Star Lake and this would add to our responsibility.

Second - to construct a bathing beach that would meet public standards of safety and sanitation and to provide maintenance and supervision as provided by law would require large expenditures of money (county funds) that are needed for other purposes at this time, and

Third - Anything other than a modern beach would only cause trouble and create problems."
