## RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, assembled in their office in the Courthouse in a regular adjourned session on the 16th day of October 1964, all members being present

WHEREAS, it is the intent and the duty of the Board of County Commissioners to preserve and protect all county property, and

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Board of County Commissioners to provide for the safety and wellbeing of the public in all matters which are under their jurisdiction; therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by said Board of County Commis sioners that the bridge across the Kansas River at Lecompton be be declared unsafe for normal traffic and that the following limitations be followed for future traffic use

- No vehicle of any description loaded or empty with a gross weight of more than 5 tons (10,000 Lbs.) shall be permitted to cross said bridge.
  - That any vehicle that approaches the bridge with the intent of crossing shall come to a complete stop before proceeding to cross and shall proceed at a speed not in excess of 15 miles per hour

and, WHEREAS, these regulations shall be posted on each end of said Bridge where they are plainly visible to traffic

and WHEREAS, the said Board of County Commissioners desire to enter into an agreement with the County Commissioners of Jefferson County, Kansas (bridge being owned jointly) to provide the necessary material, labor and personnel necessary to enforce the regulations and determine the proportionate cost of same to each county.
