AND WHEREAS, this Board finds and determines upon the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation that the speed limit for the following described county road or highway, to-wit:

Beginning at the Northwest Corner of 8-13-20 (23rd Haskell Ave.) also F.A.S. Rte 211 thence South one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile to the quarter corner on the West line of Section 8.

as set by K.S.A. 8-532, is greater than is reasonable or safe under the conditions found to exist on the above described county road or highway under the jurisdiction of this Board.

BE IT NOW THEREFORE RESOLVED by this Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that a speed limit of 30 miles per hour be and the same is hereby determined and declared to be a reasonable and safe speed limit for the above described county road or highway. This speed limit shall become effective when appropriate signs giving notice thereof are erected upon the county road or highway above described.

Rte. 210-04), thence South three and three quarters ($3\frac{3}{4}$) miles (F.A.S. Rte. 210-03) to the North edge of Baldwin, Kansas.
