October 15, 1965

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, met in regular adjourned session, with all members of the Board being present.

County Engineer, Casey Rice, met with the Board.

Welfare Director, John Derrick, met with the Commissioners to discuss Welfare problems.

It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Ousdahl, that we employ the Mount Hope Nursery to plant ten 9 to 10 foot Sugar Maple trees in the parking, around the Court House grounds. It passed unanimously.

A motion by Mr. Ousdahl and seconded by Mr. Booth, and passed unanimously, to adopt County-Wide Zoning for Douglas County.

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, has met at regular session on this 15th day of October, 1965, the following Commissioners being present: Walter Kampschroeder, Chairman; Elmer W. Ousdahl, Member; and Harvey M. Booth, Member;

AND WHEREAS, on the 6th day of May, 1964, this Board adopted zoning regulations for the unincorporated territory of Douglas County, Kansas, lying within three miles of the corporate limits of Lawrence, Kansas, under the authority of K.S.A. 19-2927;

AND WHEREAS, this Board now desires to extend said zoning regulations to cover the entire County of Douglas in the State of Kansas;

AND WHEREAS, THIS Board finds that for the purpose of promoting the public health, safety, morals, comfort and general welfare, the conserving and protecting of property and building values throughout Douglas County, Kansas, under the terms of K.S.A. 19-2914 et. seq., as amended, and lessening or avoiding congestion in the public streets or highways, Douglas County, Kansas, this Board should provide for the preparation, adoption, amendment, extension and carrying out of a comprehensive plan for the unincorporated territory of said county in accordance with said statutes;

BE IT NOW THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY, that for the purpose of promoting the public health, safety, morals, comfort and general welfare, the conserving and protecting of property and building values throughout Douglas County, Kansas, under the terms of K.S.A. 19-2914 et. seq., as amended, and lessening or avoiding congestion in the public streets or highways, Douglas County, Kansas, this Board proceed in an orderly manner to provide for the preparation, adoption, amendment, extension and carrying out of a county plan for the unincorporated area of said county in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 19-2914, et. seq., as amended.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all planning and zoning orders, rules and regulations presently in force in any area of Douglas County, Kansas, shall continue in force unless and until new planning and zoning orders, rules and regulations for such areas are passed or adopted.
