1966 Douglas County Assessor's Assessing Plan.

Under a new law passed by the 1965 Session of the Kansas Legislature, termed the "Self-Responsibility" act for 1966, responsibility of assessing will be upon the personal property owner, instead of the counties, as it had been in the past.

WHEREAS, between January 1 and March 1 of each year, it will be the responsibility of every person, whether they have property or whether they have no property, to see to it that their assessment is filed with the county assessor, on or before March 1 of each year to avoid a penalty for late filing. The "1966 Personal Property Assessment Form" attached to the car or truck registration card will be used by the county assessors office as a cross check to verify that all property owners have been assessed. The form will also be used as cross-check for the enumeration for the population count for the county.

WHEREAS, the head of every household must go to the designated location in your city or township within which your personal property is located as of January 1,
