for each assessing year. All personal property owners, in possession of a car, cars, truck, trucks, farm machinery, etc. must be assessed anytime between January 1, and March 1, of each year, whether you have or have not turned your "1966 Personal Property Assessment Form" which is attached to your Vehicle Registration Card to the county treasurer.

The head of every household which has no personal property must sign a no property statement and be enumerated.

Persons confined to their homes will be assessed by a county assessor's assistant after the assessor has been notified of this need.

Businesses, apartments, service stations will be assessed at their place of business.

The assessing must be completed, as instructed, by March 1, of each year to avoid the penalty for late filings.
