A motion by Mr. Kampschroeder and seconded by Mr. Booth, and passed unanimously, that the Board of County Commissioners and the Baldwin City Council, enter an agreement with the City, in law-enforcement.

WORKING AGREEMENT

BALDWIN CITY, KANSAS - DOUGLAS COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

The following agreement has been approved on the 27th day of April 1966, by the County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, and Rex Johnson, Sheriff of Douglas County, Kansas, and Roger Martin, Mayor, Baldwin City, Kansas.

The deputy Sheriff designated as the South Douglas County Deputy shall reside in Baldwin City, Kansas.

Baldwin City will pay one-half of his monthly salary of \$375, and shall be notified in advance of any change in his salary. Baldwin City will pay \$45 to said deputy each month for car allowance.

Said deputy shall serve cooperatively with the Baldwin City Marshall, each serving alternating equal shifts as agreed by both officers.

Said deputy shall not be designated as the superior police officer of the city, but shall have all the authority vested in the city marshall while serving his tour of duty, and shall be governed by all ordinances regulating the duty of the city marshall, with the exception of the ordinance stating that the city marshall shall pick up dogs.

His tours of duty shall consist of 6 days each week with relief on his days off to be furnished by the Sheriff's office.

The city of Baldwin City understands that said deputy is subject to call by the Sheriff in case of emergency. If called while on duty as a city police officer, he is to notify the city marshall or the mayor of his departure.

The City agrees that the Baldwin City marshall shall serve in full cooperation with the deputy at all times to the end that these two officers may provide the city with good law enforcement.

Either party may terminate this agreement by giving the other party 60 days notice in writing.
