## COMMISSIONER'S RECORD P



WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, has met at a regular session on this 17th day of October, 1966, the following commissioners being present: Elmer W. Ousdahl, Chairman; Harvey M. Booth, Member; and Walter Kampschroeder, Member, for the purpose of hearing evidence in connection with the revocation of the beer license of Albert O. Hicks which was granted by resolution dated January 14, 1966, for the TeePee in Grant Township near TeePee Junction, Route 4, Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas;

AND WHEREAS, the licensee, Albert O. Hicks, appears by his attorney, Kermit M. Beal, and Douglas County, State of Kansas, appears by Ralph M. King, Jr., County Attorney of Douglas County, Kansas;

AND WHEREAS, respective counsel then stipulated that the report from the Alcoholic Beverage Control office of the State of Kansas which is attached hereto marked Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference as if more fully set forth herein does, in fact, constitute the testimony that would have been given by the agents for said office had they been present in person to testify, the Sheriff of Douglas County appearing to corroborate said testimony;

AND WHEREAS, Kermit M. Beal then offers on behalf of Albert O. Hicks to voluntarily surrender said beer license for the expressed reason that Albert O. Hicks does not intend to continue in the beer business;

AND WHEREAS, AND WHEREAS, the County Attorney expressly objects to this voluntary tender and requests specific revocation of said license;

AND WHEREAS, from the file and the evidence presented before this Commission, both by stipulation and in person, this Board does find that Albert O. Hicks operated the beer tavern known as the TeePee for which a beer license was granted by resolution dated January 14, 1966, and which establishment is located in Grant Township near TeePee Junction, Route 4, Lawrence, Douglas County, Kansas, and finds that Albert O. Hicks did on October 6, 1966, permit persons to use or consume in said premises alcoholic liquor as defined by the State of Kansas laws relating thereto while not licensed as a club under a license issued by the State Director of Alcoholic Beverage Control under K.S.A. 1965 Supp. 41-2708;

BE IT NOW THEREFORE RESOLVED by this Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, that the above described beer license be revoked under authority of K.S.A. 1965 Supp. 41-2708 upon five-day notice to Albert O. Hicks for the reason he permitted persons to use or consume in said premises alcoholic liquor as defined by the laws of the State of Kansas relating thereto while such premises were not licensed as a club under a license issued by the State Director of Alcholic Beverage Control. Notice is deemed to have been given as of this date via Kermit M. Beal who appeared for Albert O. Hicks, and it is ordered that a copy of this resolution be mailed to Albert O. Hicks in care of his attorney of record, Kermit M. Beal. Kermit M. Beal.
