Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, sitting in regular session this 4th day of February, 1967, that the following policies of employment and wage classification for the Sheriff's Department be in effect as of February 1, 1967 and to continue in force at the pleasure of the Board of County Commissioners. This schedule shall apply to all regular, full time employees and shall ~~supersede~~ <sup>supersede</sup> and ~~cancel~~ <sup>cancel</sup> all previous wage provisions and or wage schedules.

Among the present authorized personell of the Sheriff's department, there shall be authorized, not to exceed 3 men, to be classified as follows:

- 1 Each - Undersheriff
- 2 Each - Captains ( A Captain shall receive the highest rate allowed in the pay schedule in accordance with his time of service.)

After sufficient service the employee shall be paid at least the minimum set forth in his wage scale bracket. The wage scale bracket covering the period of service is to compensate the more efficient and exceptional employee. An increase within the wage scale bracket may be approved only after a request is submitted to the Board of County Commissioners by the Sheriff and such request is found justified. All such requests shll be submitted in writing, list all the employees in the office, their terms of service and present rate of pay.

Upon receipt of the above described request the Board of Commissioners will either allow or refuse the requested increase.
