

COMMISSIONER'S RECORD P

3. Second party shall furnish the water meter.
4. The Maintenance of the pump, pipes and meter and all operating expenses shall be at the expense of second party.
5. Second party is to operate the well and is to sell water to the public for which he may make a charge of ten cents per one hundred gallons.
6. Second party shall keep the well in continuous operation until this contract is terminated.
7. The materials furnished by the respective parties remain the property of the party furnishing such materials. Second party agrees to keep all materials in good repair.
8. If either party shall fail to keep any of the agreements herein, the other party may, by giving the party in default written notice, cancel and terminate this agreement as and from the expiration of thirty days from the receipt of said notice.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Kansas River Bridge at Lecompton, Kansas, be closed to all traffic and that the County Engineer proceed at once to close said bridge as set forth under K.S.A. 68-1126.
