Mr. Stephenson advised that the department would try to have an answer on their recommendations to the Board of Commissioners the latter part of the week of May 20.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board being present.

Mr. Alvin Hallmark appeared before the Board to ask some questions concerning the vacating of his property as it is sold to the County. Concerning the property at 1105 New Hampshire, it was agreed that Mr. Hallmark would complete the sale transaction, but continue to live on the premises for one month paying rent to the County. Concerning the property at 1109 New Hampshire, the premises will be vacated upon completion of the sale transaction.

Bob Steele discussed maintenance at Lone Star Lake. The Board discussed with Mr. Roy for Janua Johnson a new contract for the operation of the concession facilities at Lone Star Lake. Mr. Dan Young, County Attorney, was instructed to prepare a new contract between Mr. Johnson and the Board of County Commissioners for signatures by all parties on May 22, 1968.

The Board discussed at great length the application of House Bill #1870 pertaining to SIGNS outdoor advertising signs in Douglas County as of its effective date of July 1, 1968. The Zohing Administrator was instructed to proceed under the same policy that has been in effect, pending further clarification of the statutes by the County Attorney.

CIVIL DEFENCE The Board received a letter from the Civil Defense Director requesting permission to install a bell on the warning system at FMC and to install a direct line to the CO-OP Plant. Also to install some cabled wire at the Court House to the CB antenna. Permission granted and a letter advising such was forwarded to Mr. Hellstrom.

The Board met with the Welfare Director.
