

July 1, 1968

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board being present.

Approved the minutes of the meeting of June 28, 1968.

Accept. Zowing BD The Board of County Commissioners received the minutes of the Board of Zoning Appeals meeting of June 19, 1968. It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that the County Zoning Administrator be instructed to issue a temporary and conditional permit for the mobile home, as recommended by the Board of Zoning Appeals, at the time that the water supply and sanitary sewer facilities are approved by the City-County Health Department. Motion carried unanimously.

Accept Reconnected It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that the recommended changes Changes is Zouring It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that the recommended changes of the Douglas County Zoning Regulations as submitted by the Douglas County Planning Commission at the meeting of April 25, 1968, be accepted except for recommendation #2 pertaining to Article 5-1.01.01. No change shall be made to this article at this time.

It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that the Board instruct the City-Co. Bldg. Chairman to send a letter to the City Commission asking that they send the Board a formal declaration of their intention to participate in joint use of the County Governmental Facility, and in view of that, will they indicate their desire to participate in (1) a total building complex, or (2) a judicial-law enforcement building as a section of the total building program. Motion carried unanimously.

Contracts : Amino Bar It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that the Board authorize the State Highway Commission to enter into a contract with Amino Brothers in the amount of \$227,498.37 for the approach work on the Douglas County side of the Lecompton Bridge. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Mr. Booth and seconded by Mr. Kampschroeder that the Board approve WATER + SEWEE the agreement for the Comprehensive Area-Wide Water and Sewer Planning Study to be conducted by the firm of Bartlett & West, Consulting Engineers, 310 West 33rd. Street, Topeka, Kansas. Agreement is subject to approval of a grant from the Farmers Home Administration. Fee for the planning study to be at the rate of 50% per capita for the residents of Douglas County outside the cities of the first class. Total cost to be paid by the Farmers Home Administration. Motion carried unanimously.

SULLIVER CONTRACT The Board executed the Sullivan Contract for property at 1107 New Hampshire at a total cost of \$13,200.00.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on July 3, 1968.
