After much discussion, it was decided that the firm of Schlup, Becker, and Brennan would submit to the Board for their consideration a revision of the contract between Douglas County and Schlup, Becker, and Brennan showing the additional cost requirements for a detailed study on two structures in place of one as agreed under the terms of the original contract. It was further agreed that the engineering firm would submit to the Board six copies each of proposed two lane and four lane structures with a southern terminus at Sixth and Tennessee Streets. These plans to show tenative alignment and a tenative approximate cost for each type of design. Drawings and proposed modifications of contract to be received by the Board by November 1, 1968.
