Employ The Board authorized Lucille Allison, Clerk of the District Court, to hire Elizabeth Howard Smith at a starting salary of \$285.00 per month effective November 1, 1968.

WATER LINE The Board approved a water line crossing on the County Road #647 in the SE¹ of Section 12 Township 14, Range 18 for Bradford Powell.

Comm. Action Mr. J. W. Smith with the Office of Economic Opportunity appeared before the Board along with Mrs. Della Hamilton, Mrs. Phyllis M. Sapp, and Mrs. Kenneth Rothwell, members of the Douglas County Resources Board. It was moved by Mr. Kampschroeder and seconded by Mr. Glass that the East Central Kansas Economic Opportunity Corporation, Inc. be designated as the Community Action Agency for Douglas County, Kansas, from April 1, 1969 to March 31, 1970. Mr. Glass and Mr. Kampschroeder voted in favor. Mr. Booth voted against giving the following reasons for his vote.

"I am not expressing disapproval of the local programs, but on the acceptance of a responsibility over which the County has no control and on which no information has been formed and presented to the Commission."

Don Venhaus, Assistant City Manager; Don Robertson and Dick Peters, Architects; met with the Board to discuss the planning for the proposed judicial building.

The payroll for the month of October was approved by the Board. See proof of publication on file in the office of the County Clerk.

The Board met with the Welfare Director.
