This railing to be constructed in conjunction with the County Road and Bridge Department. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Mr. Heck and seconded by Mr. Ice that Mr. Purvis be authorized to expedite any repairs to County property not exceeding \$100.00 expense. Motion carried unanimously.

PROPERTY Mr. Walter W. Blevens of the Property Valuation Department, Topeka, Kansas, appeared before VALUATION the Board to explain the work he will be doing in Douglas County in the next two weeks to verify property valuations made by the County Assessor in Douglas County.
