Planning: Mr. Blossom resigns The Board received a copy of a letter of resignation from Homer O. Blossom of Baldwin, Kansas, submitting his resignation as a member of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission as of March 4, 1970. The matter of an appointee for replacement will be investigated by Mr. Heck with the City representatives of Baldwin, and a recommendation of a replacement made in the next few days. Also that a letter of appreciation for his services be forwarded to Mr. Blossom.

The Board approved a legal notice pertaining to the Board of Equalization hearings for the year 1970.

juvenile detention facilities Further discussions were held pertaining to the possible use by the juvenile authorities of any of the County owned properties to the east of the Courthouse was held. It appeared there were no properties that could feasibly be used without considerable remodeling and renovation and it was the decision of the Board to proceed with the sale of the properties as scheduled.

The Board received a letter from Dan Pherigo, County Extension Agent, with recommendations as to possible shower facilities at the 4-H Fairgrounds and suggested alternative locations. Matter will be referred to the building supervisor for his recommendations and a decision will be made.
