Approved the minutes of the meeting of April 29, 1970. Commissioners Cancellation Orders #742 and #743 were approved by the Board and signed Comm Order #742 & by the Chairman. Orders are on file in the office of the County Clerk. #743 The Board received the report of Jail Inspection of the Douglas County Jail dated April 30, 1970, inspection being made by the District Judge and the County Attorney during the February 1970 term of District Court. The items recommended to be given attention by the Board were noted and the Sheriff was instructed to take immediate steps to secure heavy steel screen over the window recommended to be covered. The County Engineer was requested to weld a window bar which appears to have been cut and to Report of Jail see that all plastering is repaired. Building and Maintenance Supervisor was requested Inspection andto arrange for the repair of a light fixture in cell #3. Of particular importance comments by the Board noted the three paragraphs of the report which state as follows: Judge Gray Over the years that the inspections of the jail have been conducted, the reports have consistently shown that the Douglas County Jail has been maintained and operated as well as the facilities permit. This continues to be true at the time of this report, and is a credit to the Sheriff and his staff and to the support given them by the Board of County Commissioners. This should not, however, cause us to overlook the reality that the jail facility is inadequate for the needs of the county. Security hazards, presented by the facility,

do exist and the facilities lack in design, structure, and size the characteristics they should have for security in the handling of prisoners, juvenile offenders, female defendants, and cases of mental illness.

Plans for new jail facilities are underway. The foregoing comments are merely to point out that the need for new jail facilities remains an urgent one.

The Board discussed with the County Engineer the necessary bridge construction for the Mud Bridge replacement of the Mud Creek Phase of the Lawrence Leevy System. Received from the engineer tenative cost estimates on the two required bridges indicated as MC-1 and MC-2 totaling Creek Phase of the \$161,200.00. No further action to be taken on the bridges until the Corps and the Lawrence Leevy Systemsponsoring agent and the Board of County Commissioners establish a time table for the needed work.

> The Board received and approved a statement of policy for flood protection needs for the water resource development which will apply to Clinton Reservoir and Perry Reservoir and local flood protection.

The Board received application for relief from a tax grievance on land in Palmyra application for relieTownship. Land to be used as a site for a monument commemorating the Battle of from a tax grievance Black Jack and for park purposes.

Short, Director of Planning of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission, to provide a land use study and zoning regulation from the City of Eudora. Request was made by the Clerk that a meeting be set up between the Eudora Council and the County Commissioners and representatives of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission.
