Mr. Frazier advised that if his proposal was accepted, he anticipated plans and specifications could be completed in not to exceed ninety days. Optimizion on Mr. L. D. Rice, County Engineer, presented a copy of a letter received from the Frisbie Bridge Company, Inc. requesting fifty additional working days on their contract for the construction of the bridge over the Kansas River at Lecompton, Kansas. The Board received notice of tax protest from the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Fraternal Association, tep protestadvising payment of their second half 1969 real property and personal property tax under malprotest. Original statement of protest is filed with the Douglas County Treasurer. The Board approved the Purchase Orders for the month of May. Approved the minutes of the meeting of June 15, 1970. Mr. John Clyatt, County Zoning Administrator, appeared before the Board to discuss a pending application for rezoning of a tract of land on the north side of Highway 40, immediately west of the city limits of Lawrence. Said tract previously having been used and operated as Sweeney's Market under a non-conforming use in an 'A' Agriculture area. The new owner of the property proposes to operate a wholesale electric firm from the improvements, and proposes to file and request a change in zoning. No action was taken by the Board, pending receipt of recommendations from the Planning Commission. Mr. Heck moved we accept the report from Bartlett & West, Consulting Engineers, Topeka, Report: Comp. area Study Kansas, refering to the Comprehansive Area Study For Water and Sewerage for Douglas County. On the basis of our preliminary study of the report, we find the report a well-written, comprehensive report easily read and understood, and should provide guidelines for future Water and Sewerage development of our County. Mr. Ice seconded and motion carried unanimously. Mr. Ice moved that we accept the agreement between Finney & Turnipseed, Consulting Engineers

S, Mud Creek Asidges Mr. Ice moved that we accept the agreement between Finney & Turnipseed, constituting Engineer of Topeka, Kansas, for the design and specifications for two bridges to be constructed over Mud Creek in Douglas County, subject to the modification of the agreement by a right for Douglas County to terminate the agreement upon completion of field check plans and the lump sum payment of \$2,250.00. The Board met with Bob Hellstrom, Douglas County Civil Defense Director, Rex Johnson, Douglas County Sheriff and Merle McClure, a Lieutenant in the Lawrence Police Department to discuss the current status of the local Civil Defense Dept., particularly in reference to the existing weather watch system.

Civil Defense, weather watch system

The Board was advised by Mr. Hellstrom as to the present operation of the weather watch personnel operated through Civil Defense; the Sheriff advised the present plan of operation in effect by his Department, and Lt. McClure explained the position of the Lawrence Police Dept. After receiving the report the Board requested that all three representatives advise the Board if there were any items needing attention by this Board or if any problems developed which could be straightened out by assistance from our Board. It appearing that the present system is probably working at a maximum capability, considering the small number of people involved, the Board took no further action.
