Hearing for 1971 Budger Aug; 14, 1970

Representatives of the Soil Conservation Service and Wakarusa Watershed appeared before the Board to discuss the proposed construction of Floodway 1, of lower Wakarusa Watershed, more commonly known as the Louisiana Street Drainage Ditch. Main consideration of the discussion centered around the alocation of construction costs between the various interested parties. Mr. George Schurr, State Conservation Engineer, suggested that the bid items be changed to make one item for excavation and disposal, providing for 40,000 cu. yd. to be disposed of at a south waste area, approximately 25,000 cu. yd. to be used for dikes and the balance of approx mately 75,000 cu. yd. to be hauled to a north disposal area. Mr. Schurr advised that taking into consideration the normal 500 ft. free haul, the amount of material to be disposed of at the South, it would require a Douglas County participation of 14% of the total bid item for excavation and disposal, estimated to be approximately \$13,500. Board advised that a decision would be made by the Board by Wednesday, July 29, 1970.

Board approved for publication the proposed budget for the year 1971; set date for public hearing of August 14, 1970, at 10:00 A.M.. Total proposed budget \$5,732,201.40, requiring a total County levy of 26.87 mills.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Monday, July 27, 1970.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in special session with all members of the Board being present.

Board met with representatives of the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, City Engineer and County Staff to discuss the proposed bridge replacement on the Mud Creek phase of the Lawrence Levy.

Board was advised that the size structures as designed by our consultants were not of ade-quate size to meet the Corps specifications. There is not ample clearance, designed for 2.1 foot clearance, Corps requirement 3 foot minimum. Slide slope as designed was 2.1, Engineers Corps requirements 3.1 slope. With a 2.1 slope it would require a complete redesign of specifications levy banks, the Corps would be required to do considerable extra work at the bridge locations for which they have no authority: estimated additional cost the corps of

Plans as submitted by Corps would necessitate bridge structures estimated to cost as follows: MC-1, 28' roadway \$115,000.00; MC-II, 28' roadway \$90,000.00, both including grading costs. Plans as developed by consultant for Douglas County estimated to cost as follows: MC-I, \$74,200.00; MC-II, \$68,300.00, both costs to include grading.

Board advised the Corps that the statutory limit of \$80,000.00 per bridge would have to apply on both structures, and that any excess costs would have to be met by other sponsoring agencies. Tentative costs to build bridges to Corps of Engineers specifications with the following roadway widths are as follows:

MC-I - 24' roadway, straight alignment - \$95,000.00 - 85,000.00 MC-II - 28' - ti

A decision on participation by other agencies to be given by August 12, 1970.
