The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board being present.

Approved the minutes of the meeting of August 31, 1970.

Palary increase, Board approved a one year service salary increase for Georgia E. Smith, Clerk in the County Searge a Smith Treasurer's office, effective rate \$335.00 a month, effective Sept. 1, 1970.

The Board executed an agreement with James Eberhard of 1044 Conn. Street, for the purchase of two structures presently located on the County owned land east of the Courthouse. Structures to be removed in a clearance of the site from the area of the proposed new Judicial Building, agreement in the amount of \$7.50 for a dwelling at 1103 Rhode Island, and a second dwelling at 1116 New Hampshire.

The Board received a copy of the minutes of the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission meeting held August 26, 1970. Item #4 of the minutes being the only portion pertaining to Douglas County, this item came up for consideration. The Planning Commission recommendation was that the plat be approved, subject to the roads meeting County specifications, and requested the County Commission to secure an option to purchase the land proposed for Shank Hill Recreational Park prior to or at the time of approval of the plat. Mr. Heck moved we approve the Plat of Shank Hill, the same being an approximate 76.8 acre tract located in the Southeast corner of Section 26-13-19 on U.S.. Highway 59; said approval being subject to the final plat meeting all Douglas County road specifications. Seconded by Mr. Ice. Mr. Glass abstained from voting due ato personal involvement. Motion carried.

Mr. Heck moved action be delayed one week, pending receipt of clarifying letter from the developers relative to Planning Commission recommendation, Douglas County Commission exercising the option securing the right to purchase land proposed for Shank Hill Regional Park. It being the decision of this Board that in lieu of an option that the developers grant the right to purchase said land for Shank Hill Regional Park to any governmental agency for the sum of \$14,000. for a period of time expiring June 3, 1971. Seconded by Mr. Ice; Mr. Glass abstained from voting because of personal involvement. Motion carried.

Board received a report from the Douglas County Engineer pertaining to road Petition #698, signed by County resident Danny Brune and fourteen other County residents, received by the Board on August 21, 1970.

K.Sa. 68-114

County Engineer advised that the road Petition was unnecessary, and recommended that the road relocation be undertaken under K.S.A. 68-114 in lieu of 68-102 to which the Petition referred, and that legal publication be made under authority of K.S.A. 68-114. Upon recommendation of the Douglas County Engineer it was moved by Mr. Heck that the Board under authority of K.S.A. 68-114 on this second day of September, 1970, determine to relocate Federal Route #1275 by connecting said Route with Kasold Dr. in the City of Lawrence by a County road to be known as County road #698, said road beginning at the Northeast Corner of Section 27, Township 12 South, Range 19 East in Douglas County, Kansas; thence South between Sections 27 and 26 about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile; thence in a Southwesterly direction in Section 27 to the intersection of Kasold Drive and Trail Road in the City of Lawrence, Kansas. Said road to follow this line as near as is practical when centerline is surveyed. Length of road about 3/4 mile. Motion was seconded by Mr. Ice and carried unanimously.
