On the 23rd day of September, 1970, the Board of County Commissioners met at the Northeast Corner of Section 27, Township 12 South, Range 19 East in Douglas County, Kansas, as stated #1275 viewing to be taken for the relocation, laying out and altering of Federal Aid Route #1275, by connecting said route with Kasold Drive in the City of Lawrence by a County road to be known as County Road #698, the description of said road being as follows:

> Beginning at the Northeast Corner of Section 27, Township 12 South, Range 19 East in Douglas County, Kansas; thence South between Sections 27 and 26 about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile; thence in a Southwesterly direction of Section 27 to the intersection of Kasold Drive and Trail Road in the City of Lawrence, Kansas. Said road to follow this line as near as is practical when centerline is surveyed. Length of road about 3/4 mile.

The Board of County Commissioners determined that a negotiated value or purchase price could not be ascertained with the owners of the lands not already acquired by purchase, and that the lands not already acquired by purchase could not be obtained by sale or donation. The Board further determined that said land should be obtained by the exercise of the right of eminent domain pursuant to K.S.A. 26-501.

A copy of these minutes, together with a plat of said road as changed, shall be filed in the office of the County Clerk as the written report of the findings of the Board of County Commissioners.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Friday, September 25, 1970.

The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular adjourned session with all members of the Board being present.

Approved the minutes of the meeting of September 23, 1970.

The Board authorized the Welfare Department to close the office doors to the public for one day, Wednesday, September 30, 1970, in order to completely reorganize the files for operation under the new plan and program as ordered by the Federal government. The director was advised to be certain that adequate publication of the closing was given to all types of news media well in advance of the closing.

The Board received a communication from the Ass't City Manager of the City of Lawrence in reference to the Memorandum Agreement pertaining to the Shank Hill Regional Park site. The Ass't City Manager advised that the Lawrence City Commission had been appraised of the fact that the Memorandum Agreement was available to allow the City of Lawrence or any other gov-Commission ernmental agency to purchase this property for park purposes; however the City Commission of the City of Lawrence are not interested in acquiring this property for park purposes.

Salary increase The Board approved a salary increase for Charlotte M. Heiserman, radio dispatcher for the Sheriff's Department, salary increase in accordance with the approved Sheriff's scale to reflect a two years length of service; the new salary to be \$500.00 per month, effective September 1, 1970.

Read + Bridge The Board approved the repair of a 1969 pick-up truck owned by the Road and Bridge Department, repair to be done by the John Haddock Ford Co., estimated cost, \$427.78. Repairs are struck repair necessitated due to a collision which occurred September 22, 1970.

The County Engineer and Ass't County Engineer presented to the Board a proposed Douglas Co. Highway marking system for Douglas County roads. The plan was patterned after a State approved numbering system as developed in January, 1963. Estimated cost of the material for the proposed marking, approximately \$6,000.00. After discussion it was moved by Mr. Ice that the County Road and Bridge Dept. be authorized to proceed at once with securing the necessary material to implement the sign program for the marking of the County roads located in Douglas County. Seconded by Mr. Heck and carried unanimously.

Mr. Heck moved that because of an error in measurement, we correct the minutes of September Mr. Heck moved that because of an error in measurement, we correct the minutes of September 16th, referring to purchase of carpet for the Juvenile Courtroom, and that the cost of said carpet is to be \$344.75 instead of \$180.00 as previously recorded. After discussing two bids received for furniture for the Juvenile Courtroom, Mr. Heck moved we purchase from M & M Office Supply the following pieces of equipment at a total cost of \$690.45:
