*May-Ranson-Sheetz  
low bidder*

The bids were taken for verification of extensions by the Co. Engineer to make his recommendation for awards. After checking the computations and extensions, the Co. Engineer advised that the low bidder for the project was May-Ranson-Sheetz, Contractors, Inc. of Topeka, Kansas. It was moved by Mr. Heck that the Co. Engineer be instructed to prepare the necessary contract documents for the award of the project to the low bidder at a grand total price of \$226,442.87, such total including the alternative for the surfacing of the roadway. Seconded by Mr. Ice and carried unanimously. The Co. Engineer was further instructed to have the contracts ready for execution by the Board on Friday, Dec. 11, 1970.
