*Employ: Ronald Johnson Assessor's Ofc.*

Darwin Rogers, County Assessor, appeared before the Board requesting the employment of Ronald K. Johnson as Clerk in his office effective March 17, 1971, at \$1.75 per hour until April 1, 1971. Beginning April 1st, his salary will be \$160.00 per month on a half-time basis. It was moved by Mr. Ice and seconded by Mr. Cragan that authority be granted. Motion carried unanimously.

*Comm. Order # 869*

Commissioners Cancellation Order #869 was approved by the Board and signed by the Chairman. Order is on file in the office of the County Clerk.

*Application, beer license Dee Poindexter*

Board noted receipt of an application by Mr. Dee Poindexter of Willow Springs Township for a cereal malt beverage license. Application will be forwarded to the Township Board for their consideration.

*Request to Gov. Com. for funds supported Achievement Place for Girls*

There appeared before the Board the following persons representing Achievement Place: Mon-trose Wolf, Terry Harper, Deena Harper, Sue Midyett, Elery L. Phillips and Dean L. Fixsen. Their visit was for the purpose of requesting the Board's approval of a request to the Governor's Committee on Criminal Administration for a grant in the amount of \$26,365. to be used for the establishment and operation for the Achievement Place for Girls. After discussion to gain some understanding of the program, it was moved by Mr. Cragan and seconded by Mr. Ice that the Board support this request. Motion carried unanimously. The Board of Commissioners also agreed to address a letter to Thomas W. Regan, Director of the Governor's Committee on Criminal Administration, requesting that any proceeds granted to Achievement Place for Girls, Inc. be remitted directly to that organization rather than to the Douglas County Treasurer. It is understood that there will be an independent audit of the organization's funds made on an annual basis.

*31st St. Const. parties involved right-of-way*

Mr. Van Doren and Mr. Hammond, of the firm of Van Doren, Hazard, Stallings and Schnacke, along with County Engineer Rice and Ass't Engineer Sanderson, appeared before the Board to discuss with parties involved in right-of-way, etc., with the 31st Street construction. These people present were: Mrs. Marie Reynolds, Mrs. Marion Roberts, Mr. Wm. Meairs, Mr. Bud Moore and Mr. Howard Conkey. Mr. Van Doren and our Engineers explained to those present what would be involved concerning them in the 31st Street construction, and all present seemed to agree that the plans proposed were probably as good as could be developed.

*Requirements presented*

The extent of right-of-way requirements was presented to those from whom right-of-way would be required for their consideration.
