County Assessor Darwin Rogers appeared before the Board to discuss with the Board a Directive that all Assessors have received from the Property Valuation Department, requiring the Asses sor of each county to submit to a minimum of 6 merchants and/or manufacturers doing business in each county, a form to be filled out by these merchants, a form relating to facts concern ing the merchants' inventory and other matters during the year 1970. After considerable dis cussion it was generally agreed by Mr. Rogers and the Board that possibly an at random choos ing of the businesses to receive this form would be best, and that further it would seem well to catagorize businesses in the area of service, wholesale, retail and manufacturing, and make random selections from these catagories in order to provide a good cross-section of businesses in our County.
