The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the communications systems presently in operation and used by Douglas County Agencies and Organizations. After considerable discus- sion it seemed readily apparent that radio communications to the Sheriff's office from out- lying areas of the County are very inadequate. Further discussion centered around the ad- vantages and disadvantages of portable and mobile units. It was unanimously agreed that we should at this time take advantage of resources being made available by the State through the Governor's Committee on Criminal Administration.

City-County Planning Director, Ron Short, accompanied by Intern Planner Kent Schell and Mr. Mal Graham of the firm Black & Veatch, consulting engineers, appeared before the Board to Acquilations with primary emphasis on the anticipate Acquilations with primary emphasis on the anticipate urban growth area south and southeast of the City of Lawrence and near the Clinton Lake De-discussed velopment Area. Following general discussion Mr. Short presented to the Board recommendadiscuss pertinent aspects of sanitation regulations with primary emphasis on the anticipated urban growth area south and southeast of the City of Lawrence and near the Clinton Lake Detions which would require sewer systems in sub-divisions in this area and also recommendations to facilitate and implement such requirements. The Board received these recommendations for further consideration. Mr. Graham related that his firm is now engaged in a study of the City of Lawrence primary growth area relative to water, sanitation and related problems. He indicated in connection with this work his firm would present a very preliminary review of sewer possibilities, pipe size, etc. in the area mentioned earlier. It was furthe understood that Mr. Oraham would in the next few weeks present for the consideration of the Board a proposal for a more in depth study of this area similar to the work now being done for the City of Lawrence. The Board agreed to receive such a proposal with no obligation.
