Civil Defense Director, Chuck Belote, appeared before the Board with the information that he had received notice that gas masks which he had requested some months ago, were now available as surplus from the office of Civil Defense. Mr. Belote suggested that we request 30 of these masks for the use of the local Civil Defense volunteer unit, and an additional 30 which he would issue to the Traffic and Security Dept. of the University of Kansas. These masks will be available at a cost of \$1.00 each. It was moved by Mr. Ice, seconded by Mr. Cragan that in order to adequately provide for the safety of those who might be called into service as Civil Defense volunteers in the event of disasters resulting from fire, chemical disasters and other catastrophies that we approve Director Belote's request for 60 of these masks. Motion carried unanimously.

report*

County Zoning Administrator, Wayne Kellum, appeared before the Board to present his 3rd Qtr. report. The report shows permits issued for residences of a total estimated valuation of \$351,000., for which permit fees were collected in the amount of \$400.00. The report further shows permits issued for Mobile Homes an estimated value of \$43,400., with permit fees collected in the amount of \$120.00. The report also shows Commercial permits issued with estimated total valuation of \$1,502,750., with total permit fees collected of \$105.00. The major commercial project being the Airco Industrial Gas Plant. The total estimated value of all permits issued for the quarter being \$1,897,150., with total permit fees collected of \$706.50.

Mr. McClanathan, Mr. Short and Mr. Kellum appeared before the Board to discuss items considered by the Lawrence-Douglas County Planning Commission on Sept. 22nd. Mr. McClanathan presented to the Board Item #14 on that agenda, which item referred to a request for a conditional use permit to allow for a rooming house for the aged affecting property described as the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of 17-14-19 in Willow Springs Township, owned by Harvey J. and Maurine Bogert; the request having been submitted by Mr. and Mrs. Bogert. Following due consideration it was moved by Mr. Ice, seconded by Mr. Cragan that we approve the recommendation of the Planning Commission, which was for the approval of the conditional use permit, with the stipulation being added by this Board that issuance of the permit be subject to approval of the sanitation system by the State Board of Health. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. McClanathan then presented Item #15 which referred to the request for a conditional use permit to allow for a fire station to be erected on a certain understood property, some 135 ft. north of Highway 40 in Big Springs, Kans. The application was submitted by the Leocompton Fire Dist. Following due consideration during which time several questions pertaining to County Zoning regulations were raised, it was moved by Mr. Cragan, seconded by Mr. Ice that action on this request be delayed, pending clarification of various facts pertaining to Zoning regulations as would relate to this request. Motion carried unanimously.
