Ass't Engr. Sanderson appeared before the Board to further discuss the speed limits which a strong should be posted on newly constructed roads in Douglas County. Engr. Sanderson indicated that studies he has made of existing standards relative to site distances, etc. indicate the rea sons for his recommendations to this Board, and prepared Resolution. Resolution #71-19 refers to what is known as the Middle Road running from the Lecompton Robert Steele Highway the t east to what is known as the McCreath corner. Engr. Sanderson has drawn this Resolution declaring a 50 mile speed limit on this road. It was moved by Mr. Cragan, seconded by Mr. Ice that Res. #71-19 be hereby adopted. Carried unanimously. Engr. Sanderson then presented to the Board Res. #71-20 related to that road known as the Middle Road from the McCreath corner south to what has been known as the Fritzel corner; thence further south on what we have known as the Middle Road Extension ending at the exist ing City limits or at the junction of Trail Road and Kasold Drive. Engr. Sanderson recommends in this Resolution that this section of road be hereby declared a 40 mile per hour speed limit area. It was moved by Mr. Ice, seconded by Mr. Cragan that Res. #71-20 be 40 mile hereby adopted. Motion carried unanimously. Apple Board noted receipt and approval of monthly reports of the offices of County County County Clerk, Register of Deeds, Engineer's Dept. and the Sheriff. Commissioners Cancellation Order #923 was approved by the Board and signed by the Chairman. Order is on file in the office of the County Clerk. for the express work of painting the Courthouse tower clock. The amount of the premium is \$40.00.
