The Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County met in regular au all members of the Board present.

Approved the minutes of the meeting of January 17, 1972.

Upon recommendation of the Douglas County Solid Waste Committee Chairman, Mr. Travis Glass, the Board approved the employment of Mr. David Blackman as the coordinator of the Douglas County Solid Waste plan. Mr. Blackman is employed under the Emergency Employment Act at a salary of \$700.00 per month, effective Jan. 19th.

Mr. Bob Steele, Caretaker at Lone Star Lake, appeared before the Board to request that Mr. Employ: Grey albert Greg Albert, an employee of the Park Dept., be employed on a permanent basis as of Feb. 1st, at a salary of \$400.00 per month. It was moved by Mr. Ice, seconded by Mr. Cragan that this request be granted. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Thompson, Mr. Foley and Mr. Bowles, representing the Equitable Life Assurance Society, Decenerion of Group incurance for county supergrice, appeared before the Board to further discuss with the Board group insurance for County employees. Mr. Foley explained to the Board that insurance programs for such groups as County employees have by legislation been exempted from wage-price Board salary increase restrictions.

Mr. Earl Wilson, Historical Supervisor, appeared before the Board to present annual reports of income and expenditures of the Santa Fe Trail Historical Society, the Lecompton Historical Society and the Douglas County Historical Society.

Mr. Caine, Mr. Pierson and Mr. Pouchee appeared before the Board to discuss with the Board plans of the Douglas Co. Amateur Baseball Assn. to carry on their baseball program at the Fairgrounds during the coming year.
