Res # 72-5:  
Attorney Comm.  
Districts

The Board again discussed the matter of the three Commissioners' Districts as regards the apparent disparities which have developed. The Board then considered Resolution #72-5 relating to the altering of the three Commissioners' Districts to resolve the apparent disparity in population which has developed. It has been determined by the Board that the following changes in Commissioners' Districts would reduce the population differential between the three districts from some 20% to less than 3%: add the 5th and 7th precincts of the 3rd Ward to District #2; add the 3rd precinct of the 4th ward to District #1 and add the 1st, 2nd and 4th precincts of the 2nd ward to District #3. These changes do not alter the compactness of the 3 districts, but only bring the population of the 3 districts into better balance. Relative to 1971 census figures, these alterations will reflect the following population figures of the 3 districts: Dist. #1 - 17,932, Dist. #2 - 17,834 and Dist. #3 - 18,314. After due discussion it was moved by Mr. Ice, seconded by Mr. Cragan that Res. #72-5 be hereby adopted. Motion carried unanimously.
