Discussion on
setting speed
limits on
County roads.

Engineer Sanderson and Surveyor McGee appeared before the Board to discuss the most appropriate method by resolution setting speed limits on county roads. After considerable discussion, it was agreed that resolutions relative to speed limits should cover only those county roads which are now commonly known as black top roads and which have not otherwise been covered by speed resolutions. It is further understood that as roads become black top, proper standard resolutions will then be adopted to set speed limits on those roads. Engineer Sanderson and Surveyor McGee agreed that this seemed to be the proper procedure and will prepare resolutions according to this agreed procedure.

Call from Motor
Veh. Dept. regarding

The Board received a call from the Motor Vehicle Department requesting a room be made available in the Douglas County Courthouse for the purpose of accommodating a motor vehicle investigator. Quarterly Report
from Dept. of
Health

The Board noted receipt of a quarterly report by Irma Setnor, Registered Nurse of the Department of Health. The report indicates the need for expanding services as made available by the visiting nurses association. The visiting nurses association receives funds from Medicare, Medicaid, United Fund, and private payments. The report indicates the health department is exploring other sources of funds.
