Received the application of Mr. Clarence W. Anderson of Clinton Township for a license to sell cereal malt beverages at retail at Clinton Store, Route 4, Lawrence. Application is henerage for chainer forwarded to the Clinton Township board for their denial or approval.

Counselor Young appeared before the Board to discuss his continuance as County Counselor for the year 1972. Counselor Young indicated that his retention as Counselor has been largely on a trial basis and he in a beginning year had not been in a position to properly determine the amount chargeable to the County for office expense relative to his work as Counselor. Mr. Young indicated that after one year of experience that he was now able to do so and felt that a payment of \$80 per month would compensate for this office expense attributable to his work for the County. The Board then considered resolution No. 72-7, which resolution would establish Counselor Young's salary at \$420 per month commencing February 1, 1972. The resolution further sets out that Counselor Young will be reimbursed in the amount of \$80 each month for supplies, postage, telephone and secretarial expenses. It was moved by Mr. Ice and seconded by Mr. Cragan that resolution No. 72-7 be hereby adopted. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board received a request from County Clerk Delbert Mathia, who is now charged with Concroval to rent key punch machine for il BM coop for county click office responsibility of all county voters registration, for permission to rent a key punch machine from the IBM Corporation for use in this voter registration work. Mr. Mathia indicated that the rental of the machine seemed to be much more advantageous than purchase, when the service charge contract for a purchased machine was taken into consideration. It was moved by Mr. Cragan and seconded by Mr. Ice that this request be approved. Motion carried unanimously.

Board noted receipt from the office of County Treasurer of a statement of fund balances as of the quarter ending January 31, 1972.

The Board approved Commissioners Cancellation Order No. 969. Order is on file in the office of the County Clerk.

Received letter from Kansas State Board of Agriculture relative to the annual weed conference to be held February 22-24 at the Center City Ramada Inn, Kansas City, Kansas. The notice indicates that the first day of the conference on February 22 is a day upon which the county government problems relating to the new Kansas Pesticide Use Law will be discussed. The notice encourages all county commissioners to make an attempt to be present for the February 22 meeting.

Engineer Sanderson and Surveyor McGee appeared before the Board to further discuss the adoption of speed limits on all existing black top roads. Mr. Sanderson and Mr. McGee presented to the Board a speed limit road map of Douglas County indicating all existing black top county roads and indicating the speed limits established in various areas thereof. Engineer Sanderson and Surveyor McGee also presented to the Board resolutions which they have drawn relating to the adoption of speed limits as designated on the speed limit map. After due discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan and seconded by Mr. Ice that Resolu-A.C. - anoly tions 72-8 (1 thru 28) be hereby adopted. Motion carried unanimously. It was then moved by Mr. Cragan and seconded by Mr. Ice that the speed limit road map of Douglas County designating all existing black top county roads and the speed limit thereon be hereby adopted as of this date. Motion campied unanimously. It was agreed that copies of these resolutions and of the speed limit map, be presented to the Sheriff Department and to the office of the County Attorney and further copies of the resolutions and of the map will be available in the office of the County Commissioners and of the County Engineer.
