Wayne Kellum, Zoning Administrator, appeared before the Board with prepared Resolution No. 72-22, which resolution relates to a certain described zoning classification change from A (Agricultural) to B-2 (General Business) on the following described property:

Beginning at a point 216 feet South of the Northeast corner of Section 13, Township 13, Range 19, and 677 feet West of the East line of said Section; thence West 300 feet; thence South 291 feet; thence East 300 feet; thence North 291 feet to the point of beginning. Contains 2 acres, more or less.

Mr. Jim Smith appeared before the Board requesting a temporary conditional use permit for a public event to be known as the "Kansas Celebration for the Liberalization of the Declaration of Independence" in a certain area in Lecompton township on Monday, July 3. Following due discussion of all the problems involved and giving due consideration to the neighborhood in which the event was to be held, it was moved by Mr. Ice that under authority granted by 19-5 of the Zoning Regulations of Douglas County that this request for a temporary conditional use permit be denied. Mr. Ice and Mr. Heck voted to deny the request. Mr. Cragan abstained.

Engineer Sanderson appeared before the Board to present to the Board for approval an agreement between Douglas County and consulting firm Finney and Turnipseed. The agreement refers to engineering services to be furnished by Finney and Turnipseed to Douglas County on bridge No. 0.00N-1.81E, or known as the Franklin County line bridge. Such services to be rendered at a cost of \$900. The agreement also refers to engineering services on bridge No. 0.64N-5.50E on County Road No. 1029 and known as the Globe bridge. Engineering services relative to this bridge are to be rendered at a cost of \$1,950. Following due discussion it was moved by Mr. Cragan and seconded by Mr. Ice that this agreement be approved.
