12 Charconl burners for Lone Star Lake

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Following several discussions relative to an application requesting funds from the Governor's Committee on Criminal Administration to assist in the renovation and equipping of space in the Douglas County Historical Society building to provide for the second Douglas County District Court, the Board agreed that an application for such funds should be submitted. Estimates for this work were in the area of \$20,000 and an application will be submitted requesting G.C.C.A. funds in the amount of \$15,000 to be matched by Douglas County funds in the amount of \$5,000. All items in the request being 75-25 matching fund items.

Lucille Allison, Clerk of the District Court, requested Board approval for the employment of Lucille Anderson as clerk-typist on a temporary basis at a hourly wage rate of \$2.00 per hour effective July 6. It was moved by Mr. Cragan, seconded by Mr. Heck and carried unanimously that this request be granted.

Board received a proposal from Mr. Curtis Besinger, architect, for services he proposes to provide as liaison man between this Board and the Douglas County Historical Society for the supervising and coordination of the furnishing and renovation of space in the Douglas County Historical building for a second district court. Mr. Besinger proposes an hourly rate of \$15.00 per hour not to exceed a total of \$750. It was moved by Mr. Cragan, seconded by Mr. Heck and carried unanimously that this proposal be accepted.

Board noted receipt from the office of the Douglas County Treasurer of a trial balance of that office as of June 30, 1972.

The Board noted receipt of the monthly fee report of the offices of county engineer, register of deeds, county court, county clerk, and sheriff for the month of June.

Board noted receipt of the 1971 Audit Report from accountants Lesh-Bradley-Barrand-Schehrer. A brief discussion with auditor Frank Bradley indicated no unusual comments relative to the operations of the various county offices.

Bob Steele, caretaker of Lone Star Lake, informed the Board that there is need for additional charcoal burners at the lake. After due discussion and investigation it was moved by Mr. Cragan that we authorize Mr. Steele to order from the Kay Park-Rec Corp., twelve, Model No. MB, all steel, picnic grills at a price of \$32.50 each delivered. Motion was seconded by Mr. Heck and carried unanimously.

A completed form was remitted to the State Emergency Employment Office indicating the level of funding requested for 1973 relative to the Douglas County participation in this program. The funding level requested was in the amount of \$77,124. A second form prepared by Mr. Ernest Coleman was also remitted requesting a modification in employee benefits inasmuch as Douglas County as of June 1, 1972 is making available to all employees Blue Cross-Blue Shield health insurance as a contribution by Douglas County.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Thursday, July 13, 1972.
