Wayne Kellum, Zoning Administrator, presented the Board with the third quarter report from his office. Mr. Kellum's report showed the following third quarter permit valuations issued as compared with corresponding report of 1971:

The Board noted receipt of a letter from the office of Paul D. Barber, Chief, Engineering Division of the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, responding to Mr. Sanderson's letter of September 26. Mr. Sanderson requested comments on the proposed 23rd Street extension to the Clinton Lake access road "A". Mr. Sanderson's letter indicated that these comments were desired as a part of the environmental statement for the proposed 23rd Street project. The communication from Mr. Barber's office is very positive and indicates the necessity of a 23rd Street extension and further indicates that there would seem to be no feasible alternate to that project.
