The Board noted receipt of copy of memorandum from the State Highway Public Information Department to the Director of Highways requesting design approval from the Federal Highway Administration of Project No. (SF) 10-23 F-DP-078-6 (23). This notice of request will be legally published on December 7, 1972.

The Board noted receipt from Mr. Tom Akin of a letter requesting that a certain described property owned by him be rezoned from "A" to "I-3" according to stipulation set forth in Board minutes relating to planning commission items heard by the Board on June 30, 1971. The Board agreed a letter should be sent to the joint planning staff and planning commission chairman requesting the initiation of action to effect this zoning change.

Assessor Rogers requested employment in his office of Charlotte Shawver as clerk in his office effective when Mrs. Shawver moves here in January 1973. Mr. Rogers requested that the salary of Mrs. Shawver be \$400 per month and that she be given credit for four years experience or length of service inasmuch as she has over five years clerk-assessor experience and is presently serving as deputy-assessor in another Kansas county. It was moved by Mr. Ice that this request be approved, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

Investing additionalidle funda Bess Bennett, deputy county treasurer, and Betty Leslie conferred further with the Board relative to the possibility of investing additional idle funds in the amount of \$500,000. It was agreed by the Board and the treasurer's office that this would seem proper at this time and that we should proceed with this amount of funds as a further investment for a three months period of time.

The Board noted receipt of the December rent payment in the amount of \$250 from the Valleyview Home.

Employ ! Douglies & Walker Hermon Reed

County Attorney Elect David Berkowitz appeared before the Board to inform the Board that he had named Mr. Douglas J. Walker as first assistant county attorney. Mr. Berkowitz informed the Board that Mr. Walker would assume his duties as of February 1, 1973 and requested a salary of \$885 per month for Mr. Walker. Mr. Berkowitz also informed the Board that he had employed Mr. Herman Reed as second assistant county attorney. Mr. Berkowitz further informed the Board that Mr. Reed would begin work in his office on December 16 and requested a salary for Mr. Reed of \$750 per month. It was moved by Mr. Cragan that these requests for employment and salary be approved, seconded by Mr. Ice, and carried unanimously.

In accordance with official publication the Board received and considered at 10:00 a.m. bids for seven automobiles for the sheriff department. Bids were received from Turner Chevrolet and Jim Clark Motors. The apparent low bid was Turner Chevrolet with a bid reflecting a net cost for seven new automobiles with seven trade-ins of \$15,506.57. The Board requested Sheriff Johnson to review the bids with official action by the Board delayed until a later date.

Giving effect to aspects of work he is performing, it was moved by Mr. Ice that Mr. Charles Newman be assigned to the park department payroll as of December 1, 1972, seconded by Mr. Cragan, and carried unanimously.

The Board received notice from the Governor's Committee on Manpower Planning of their approval of the requested salary increase for Data Processing Supervisor James Tate in the amount of \$50 per month effective November 1, 1972, which makes Mr. Tate's salary \$750 per month.

No further business, the Board adjourned to meet on Thursday, December 7, 1972.
