Dean Sanderson, Public Works Director, appeared before the Board advising the Commission that pursuant to K.S.A. 68-1126, Bridge No. 09.00N-00.47E over Elk Creek has been closed to all traffic. Mr. Sanderson also stated that to open such bridge to limit three ton gross weight traffic will require extensive and costly repair. It is recommended that consideration be given to permanent closing of subject bridge. After due discussion the Commission recommended to Mr. Sanderson that extensive study be made to determine the practicality of repair and reopen for gross limit three ton weight.
