

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, pursuant to the authority and requirements of the above cited statutes, the additional compensation is allowed to the County Attorney, County Clerk, County Treasurer, Register of Deeds, Probate Judge, and Clerk of the District Court, said additional compensation to be fifteen per cent of the respective base salaries of the above-named officers, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in accordance with the direction of K.S.A. 28-820, as amended, which requires that upon a finding that the presence of a state institution of higher education or federal reservoir results in added duties for the Sheriff, the Sheriff be allowed additional compensation not exceeding fifty per cent, but not less than twenty-five per cent, of the statutory salary, this Board determines that the required additional compensation should be in the amount of thirty per cent of the statutory base salary.
