It was moved by Mr. Heck that the Board approve the statement of payment with the understanding that John Haddock will provide a statement to the effect that certain payment will be withheld from Collins Industries pending receipt by Haddock Ford and Gold Cross Ambulance of all components which are part of the original contract, seconded by Mr. Stoneback, and carried unanimously.

Tom McGee appeared before the Board to request the purchase of bridge forms from Symons Manufacturing Company in the approximate amount of \$2,555.20. It was determined by the Board that since we are using Symons forms and to keep things compatible, that we would not expose to a bidding situation in this particular case. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that this request for purchase be granted, seconded by Mr. Heck, and carried unanimously.

The Board noted a statement from Barnett-Stuart, Inc., consulting geologists, for geological investigations and reports for the Massachusetts and Vermont Street Bridges over the Kaw River at Lawrence, Kansas, of a total bill of \$18,300 for the following:
