The Board approved Commissioners Cancellation Order No. 81 to the Sheriff, Comm Order Clerk of District Court, and Treasurer. # 81 The Board authorized payment of the second half of 1974 Planning Commission in comm: Payment of 2nd Half the amount of \$10,000. The Board noted receipt of a check from the Douglas County Fairboard to the Miracle Recreation Equipment Company in the amount of \$4800 for rainbow Rech check of bleachers, Invoice No. 51345. blachera Gary Miller appeared before the Board with bids for building material for the concession building located at Lone Star Lake. Bids received aremas follows: fone Star! Bids for building Eudora Lumber Company \$7,683.51, Wickes Lumber \$7,578.95, Foster Lumber material for con Company \$7,428.32, and Lawrence Lumber Company \$7,351.95. It was moved by cession blog. Mr. Stoneback that the Board accept the low bid of Lawrence Lumber Company in the amount of \$7,351.95, seconded by Mr. Heck, and carried unanimously. Dean Sanderson, Public Works Director, made recommendation to the Board for Gub Works Pupe! the first and second phase of building county bridges. The first phase being the nine bridges in the Lecompton area, which is set out on the Douglas County phase of county map, and the second phase being the five steel beam bridges located southwest of Lawrence; two on the Wakarusa and three on Washington Creek. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that the recommendation made by the Public Works Director be approved, seconded by Mr. Heck, and carried unanimously. A map showing the location of the bridges will be on file in the Public Works Department.
