In cases where the acquisition of rights-of-way necessitates the relocation of an existing fence, allowance may be less than, but shall not exceed \$8.00 per rod for barbed wire or \$12.00 per rod for woven wire fences. Should acquisition of rights-of-way necessitate the building of fence not previously required, and such other improvements that may be involved in the acquisition, the allowance will be negotiated.

Rights-of-way acquisition on projects involving federal-aid shall follow the procedures as set forth for Secondary projects by the Federal Highway Administration and Kansas State Highway Commission, and in compliance with Chapter 244, of 1972 Session Laws of Kansas. The Director of Public Works shall be responsible for the implementation and administration of the rights-of-way acquisition policy.
