The Board discussed with Civil Defense Director Chuck Belote the manner in which we would test city of Lawrence disaster warning system. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that the sirens be tested on March 24 and March 31, and thereafter the first and third Monday of each month in all instances at 12:00 noon, and further that should threatening weather exist at time of scheduled test, such test will be rescheduled for the following Monday and further that this action supersedes all previous actions relative to testing of the disaster warning system.

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Further discussion was held with representatives of the cities of Baldwin, Eudora, and Lecompton; representatives of the consulting firm of Oblinger-Smith; and Ernest Coleman, Federal Funds Consultant.
