Ambulance:

Motorola for
radio equipment

Ted McFarlane, Douglas County Ambulance Service Manager, discussed further with the Board bids received on October 23, 1975, relative to the purchase of radio equipment for the ambulance service. Following discussion it was moved by Mr. Stoneback that we accept the recommendation of Mr. McFarlane, which recommendation was that we accept the low bid for equipment as set out in specifications which are on file. This low bid was submitted by Motorola, Inc. in the amount of \$5650. Motion was seconded by Mr. Whitenight and carried unanimously. This expenditure is to be reimbursed 50% by federal funds leaving a net cost to Douglas County of \$2825.

Right-of-way
for County bridge

Tom McGee, Engineering Division Manager of the Public Works Department, submitted a contract agreement for right-of-way in connection with construction of Bridge No. 08.84N-08.50E between Rudolf Dietz and Douglas County. The contract calls for payment to Mr. Dietz of the lump sum of \$387 for right-of-way as described in the contract agreement. It was moved by Mr. Stoneback that the Board approve this contract agreement, seconded by Mr. Whitenight, and carried unanimously.
